Business Analyst, Risk Assessment

Organization: The Canadian Public Accountability Board (CPAB) is the regulator for the public company audit industry in Canada. Established in 2003, it is based in Toronto with operations in Montreal and Vancouver and industry involvement nationally and internationally. Maintaining and enhancing a leading edge risk assessment database is essential to the success of this plan.

Role: The Business Analyst is responsible for maintaining a comprehensive database which is central to CPAB's ability perform risk-based inspections and add strategic value. The role encompasses scanning the external operating environment for potential indicators of audit risk; sourcing and disseminating briefings and reports on leading and lagging business indicators and trends; distilling recommendations for CPAB's leadership to guide the regulatory inspection function; and accumulating a repository of knowledge to inform the development of CPAB's inspection methodology. Importantly, the Business Analyst will establish productive relationships with all staff and external information service providers, and assume a significant role in fostering a learning organization.

Qualifications: Candidates should have post secondary education such as a BComm, Accounting designation, or MBA; 3 to 5 years of progressive experience in business analysis, ideally in a professional services or regulatory organization; strong analytic, database management and communications skills; and demonstrated ability to cultivate and maintain productive working relationships at all levels of the organization.
